Well done boys!

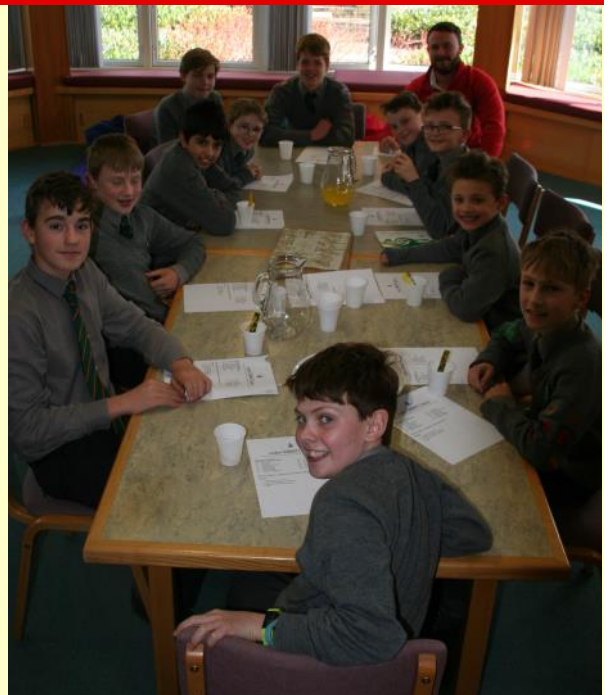

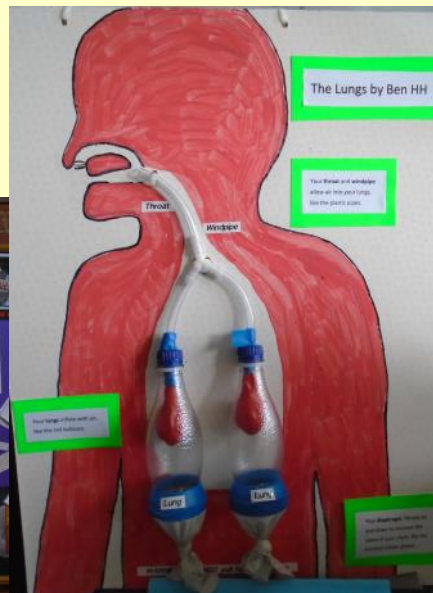
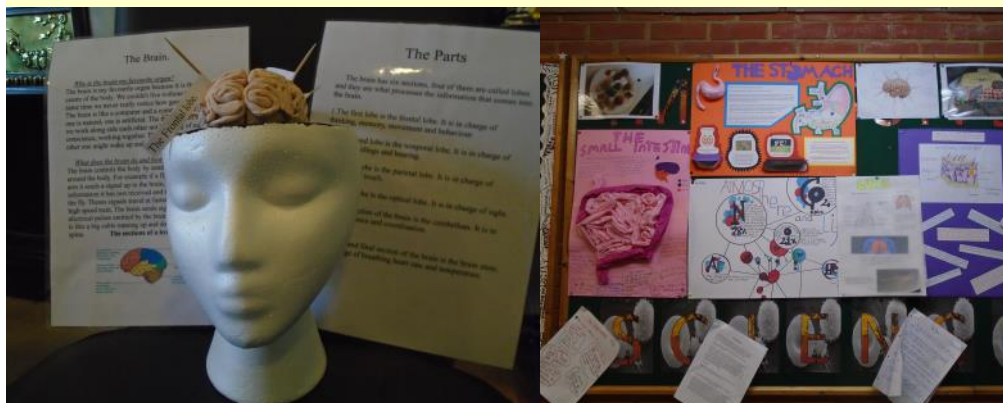




Superb Science

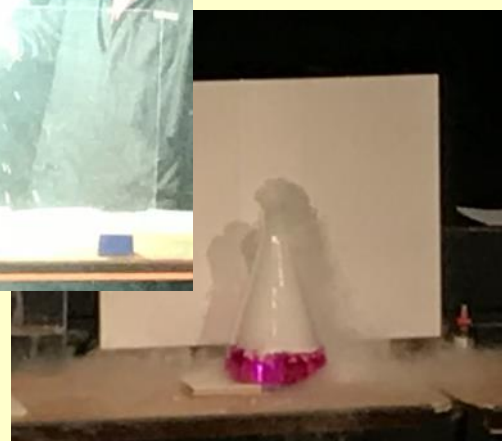

Form 3 Potions!

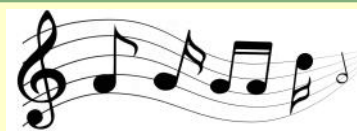
